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Greyton House welcomes pupils from families of all faiths, including those from secular backgrounds, and respects the beliefs of all.

The ethos of the school is Christian: that is codes of behaviour, morals and discipline which prevail at the school are based on those espoused by the Christian faith.

Religious teaching does not form part of the day-to-day school curriculum. However, as appropriate, all pupils receive guidance based on Christian values and lessons on comparative religion from time to time.

All pupils are included in the reciting of prayers at the school's weekly assembly. Similarly, tunes and words of some hymns (amongst other songs) are taught during singing lessons. The school adheres to all Christian holidays and traditionally holds an end-of-year festival service of carols and nine lessons to celebrate Christ's birth. Non-Christian children at Greyton House are expected, and their parents invited, to participate in these demonstrations of Christian faith, but are not required to express a belief or declare a faith.
